SPECIALIST HIGH SKILLS MAJOR

The SHSM Program has a number of required components, designed to give students a “leg-up” to pursue post-secondary opportunities in each of the identified sectors, valuing apprenticeship, college, community, university and the workplace.



Information & Communication Technology (ICT)

Students enrolled in the SHSM-Information and Communications Technology will be involved in today's rapid and exciting changes in technology and will contribute to new and emerging media and technologies in the years to come.

Arts and Culture SHSM

The Arts and Culture Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) is a program designed for students interested in pursuing a career in the arts, culture, or creative industries. It allows students to focus on developing specialized skills in areas such as visual arts, music, drama, dance, media, and design, while earning credits that meet the requirements for their high school diploma.



Construction SHSM

The Construction Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) provides students with the opportunity to gain industry-recognized certifications, develop practical skills, and acquire hands-on experience in various sectors of construction, including carpentry, plumbing, electrical work, and more. The program also focuses on essential skills such as project management, safety practices, and teamwork. Aviation & Aerospace SHSM

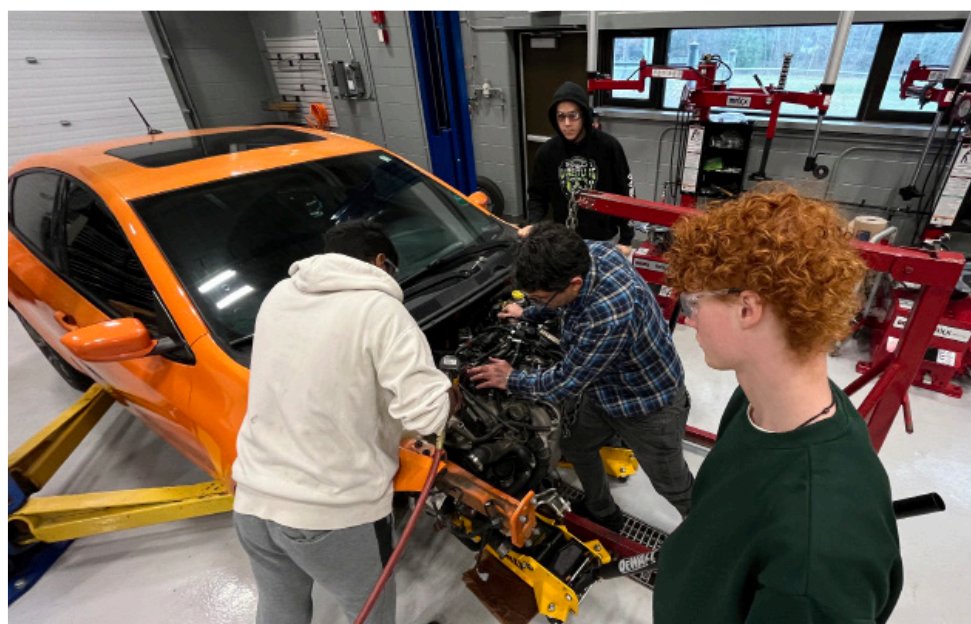

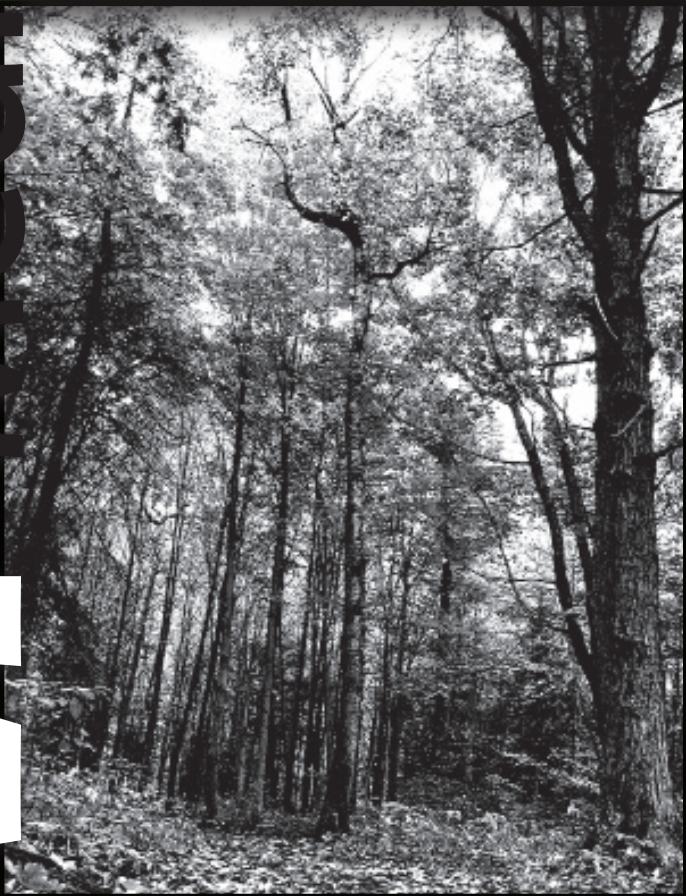
