

GRADE 10 STUDENTS - OPTION SELECTION INFORMATION

Always think about where you are going and what you will need to get there.

Pathway Options within Course Code

- U indicates University Pathway
- M indicates University/College Pathway
- C indicates College Pathway
- E indicates Workplace Pathway

If you have taken **Academic courses**, this leads you to the University pathway or any others.

If you have taken **Applied courses**, this leads you to the College or Mixed pathway.

If you have taken **Locally Developed courses**, this leads you to the Workplace pathway.

You must choose a full program of **8 courses** including two compulsory and six electives.

1 You must choose two (2) Compulsory courses.

One Grade 11 Mathematics

Important Note: The Grade 11 math course must be chosen carefully. Please ensure that you will meet the prerequisite requirements for the Grade 12 math course you need to get into college or university of your choice.

2 You must choose 6 Elective Courses

Art – Grade 10 classes are prerequisites for all the Grade 11 courses

ADC 3M/4M- Drama in the Community, AMR/4M –Concert Band, AMS 3M/4M - Pine Tones

These courses run after school and at lunchtime (a minimum of three times per week) throughout the entire school year (110 hours are needed to achieve the credit). These will be considered extra credits; therefore, you will choose **9 or 10 courses in total** on your option selection sheet.

Science

- Chemistry SCH 3U or SCH 4C (Grade 11 College Chemistry does not exist)
- Biology SBI 3U/SBI 3UA or SBI 3C (Grade 12 College Biology does not exist)
- Physics SPH 3U or SPH 4C (Grade 11 College Physics does not exist)
- Environmental Science SNV 3M or SNV 3E

Note: If you plan on going into a University science based field in post-secondary, you will need to take the appropriate pathway in Grade 11 in order to take the Grade 12 course.

Technological Studies

It is **strongly** recommended that you have the Grade 10 course if considering any Grade 11 course in this field for optimal success.



E-LEARNING

To meet diploma requirements, the completion of **two** e-Learning courses is now necessary. While we value the opportunity that eLearning provides to our students, we recognize that this type of learning may not be suitable for all students. You will be given the opportunity to opt out of the eLearning program. ADSB e-Learning courses are listed on the course option worksheet. If students are interested in other courses not listed, Student Services can show other available options.

SPECIALIZED PROGRAMS

OYAP FAST

OYAP-FAST (Focused Apprenticeship Skills Training) is a variation of the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP) that allows students in Grades 11 and 12 to participate in more apprenticeship learning through addition Co-operative Education credits while completing secondary school. The Focused Apprenticeship Skills Training program allows students to take up to 80 per cent of their senior courses in Co-op Education.
